

Today's Worship Theme

Our service today is a special treat. Today is Christ the King, or Reign of Christ, Sunday. This is the last Sunday of the church year. In celebration of our whole liturgical calendar, we will take a few moments to recall each season in a "lessons and carols" format. Each season of the church year will provide a lesson, reflection and hymn: Advent, Christmas, Epiphany, Lent, Easter, and Pentecost. The service will end with a triumphant note of celebration as we point toward a day when Jesus' reign on earth will fully merge the heaven plus earth reality that was God's intention from creation.

A special note about today: As we celebrate Christ the King Sunday, we look to the banners which hang in our worship space throughout the year. To the right of the lectern is the Season of Advent banner which begins our liturgical church year. Turning to the right, the Advent banner is followed by the Season of Christmas and the Season of Epiphany banners. In the rear of the nave and hanging on the balcony wall are those representing the Seasons of Lent and Easter. Also on the balcony wall are the Day of Pentecost and Holy Trinity. Turning to the right once again are Reformation and the All Saints banners, not as seasons of the church year, but as significant celebrations in our worship cycle. As we arrive at the banner hanging to the left of the pulpit, we find the banner of the day, Christ the King, completing the cycle of our liturgical year. Please note the two banners on either side of the chancel wall. They are the "Wheat and Wine" banners, representing Christ's presence promised through the bread and wine we receive during Holy Communion.

Come, see the place where he lay. ⁷Then go quickly and tell his disciples, 'He has been raised from the dead, and indeed he is going ahead of you to Galilee; there you will see him.' This is my message for you." ⁸So they left the tomb quickly with fear and great joy, and ran to tell his disciples. ⁹Suddenly Jesus met them and said, "Greetings!" ¹When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. ²And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. ³Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. ⁴All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability.

⁵Now there were devout Jews from every nation under heaven living in Jerusalem. ⁶And at this sound the crowd gathered and was bewildered, because each one heard them speaking in the native language of each. ⁷Amazed and astonished, they asked, "Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? ⁸And how is it that we hear, each of us, in our own native language?

¹⁴But Peter, standing with the eleven, raised his voice and addressed them, "Men of Judea and all who live in Jerusalem, let this be known to you, and listen to what I say. ¹⁵Indeed, these are not drunk, as you suppose, for it is only nine o'clock in the morning. ¹⁶No, this is what was spoken through the prophet Joel: ¹⁷In the last days it will be, God declares, that I will pour out my Spirit upon all flesh, and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, and your young men shall see visions, and your old men shall dream dreams. ¹⁸Even upon my slaves, both men and women, in those days I will pour out my Spirit; and they shall prophesy. ¹⁹And I will show portents in the heaven above and signs on the earth below, blood, and fire, and smoky mist. 20The sun shall be turned to darkness and the moon to blood, before the coming of the Lord's great and glorious day. ²¹Then everyone who calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved.'





INVITATION TO COMMUNION


Behold, God is making all things new. Take your place in the new creation.
